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# Tell the School Board and the General Assembly that 2% is not Enough!

Last night, the Virginia Beach City Public School Board adopted the budget for the division. Basically, the Superintendent's Estimate of Needs that was presented on February 6 was adopted with a 9-2 vote (Weems and Manning –no).



The budget priorities include: Reducing targeted class size, replacing aging buses and technology, equitable compensation for employees, phase in of full day kindergarten, supporting 1:1, reduce reliance on reversion funds, and contributing PAYGO to the CIP.

What does this mean? The additions of 28 full time positions: 8.6 for elementary, 4.4 for middle and 15 for high. Furthermore, 25 additional staff (12 high school counselors, 10 tech support, and

All employees will receive a 2% increase in pay. For teachers, there will be a new, pay-step instructional scale. The scale will be limited to 30 steps and a .5 pay increase will be added for each year of service. COLA's will be added as funds allow.

A 2% pay increase is disappointing and School Board members Anderson, Riggs, and Holtz stated that any funds dedicated to VBCPS from the General Assembly should be allocated for employee raises. Contact both House of Delegate and Senate Conferees and tell them to fund public education on April 10. Continue to e-mail school board members here. I am hopeful we will see a 3% pay increase for employees.
